He gladly donated his personal money at the end of the year to local churches for families that were without gifts for their children. He purchased a car with his own personal money, for a widowed employee so she would have a safe and reliable car when she could not afford to get her car repaired. Mr. and Mrs. Marsh helped an abused mom and her children get moved to a safe apartment, provided a car with their own finances, and helped her find employment. Kevin did not seek glory or recognition for these examples. Most people did not know how kind and generous he truly was.

Mr. Marsh led by example and expected his managers and supervisors to treat their employees like they would want to be treated. He continuously encouraged employees in whatever way he could to help them be successful and achieve their professional goals. If I were seeking employment today, Kevin Marsh would be the kind of boss/leader that I would want for myself, as well as my for own children.
