Dear Honorable Judge Lewis and Honorable Judge Hayes:

I am writing to express my support and admiration for Kevin Marsh. I first met Kevin when he was the Assistant Treasurer at South Carolina Electric & Gas and I was a young banker with NCNB. Kevin taught me how to be upfront in business without being arrogant. He always asked for our best price in the first bid and was honest as to why we won or lost a transaction. I worked with Kevin closely when NationsBank financed a joint venture transaction between SCANA and Westinghouse and saw firsthand how he treated both the banks and his business partners with integrity.

My business relationship with Kevin evolved into a friendship in the 1990s. Kevin married his wife Sue when they were both just 19 years old and it was clear to anyone who has known Kevin longer than ten minutes that Sue and their two daughters were the center of his world. He is one of a handful of executives that I have known who valued their family over compensation and prestige, and that never changed despite Kevin's increasing responsibilities at SCANA. My first husband died of a rare form of cancer in 2008 when our son was just 14. Kevin knew that Alec shared his father's love of cars and he soon developed a relationship with Alec via texts where they shared photos of cars that captured their attention. When Alec was a senior in high school Kevin invited us to his home and spent the entire afternoon talking cars with Alec. He even sent Alec a trickle charger as a high school graduation present because he knew Alec would have to leave his beloved Mustang at home during his first year at college. He told Alec to only buy cars that he could pay cash for and only after he had already fulfilled his pledge to his church. Kevin was consistently kind and present to Alec in a way that had nothing to do with business. Alec is 27 now and I am still grateful that Kevin took the time to help guide my son during a very difficult time for us both.

I have watched Kevin care for Sue for many years since her breast cancer diagnosis. I am personally aware of the stress a cancer diagnosis can place on a marriage and I have witnessed Kevin treat Sue with nothing but patience and grace. He loves Sue deeply and will continue to care for her with selflessness as long as he is able. Kevin is a good and kind man and I consider myself lucky to call him my friend.
