

Savannah River Site: Back to the "Bomb Plant"
From Clean Up to the Heart of the Nuclear Arms Race
with Tom Clements, SRS Watch

Absent public input, the Savannah River Site (SRS) has shifted to being managed by the nuclear weapons arm of DOE, the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), a move which could have detrimental national security and environmental impacts. Given this change, NNSA aims to further increase the site's role in nuclear war planning, with the proposed SRS Plutonium Bomb Plant being key to production of provocative, new nuclear warheads and refurbishment of all existing warheads. At an additional cost of \$18-25 billion, the plutonium "pit" project - to make new bomb cores - could be the most expensive building project in US history and may well divert resources from essential environmental remediation at SRS.
